Test-based accountability systems are based on the belief that public education can be improved through a simple strategy: require all students to take standardized achievement tests and attach high stakes to the tests in the form of rewards when test scores improve and sanctions when they do not. Test-based accountability has achieved broad support as a strategy for improving public education.

### Making Sense of Test-Based Accountability in Education

In our teachings of evidence-based medicine, we have found an easier, intuitive way to interpret the results of diagnostic studies based on 2 elements: the likelihood ratio of the test and the pretest odds. The likelihood ratio (LR) summarises information about the diagnostic test by combining information about the sensitivity and specificity .

Orient your learners to the task ahead and to the data table with its columns, rows, and data points (see Table 1): Let's make sense of these results. Flip the right-hand half of the cover sheet down, hiding the right-hand column of the data on Page 1, leaving the left-hand column visible: The left side of this table shows the test results for all the patients found by the bone marrow to have iron deficiency .
