To build a chord in any key, use the exact same formula: Root, Major Third & Perfect Fifth. If, for example, you want to play an F piano chord, just use the formula; root, major third and perfect fifth. The chord would then consist of an F (Root Note), an A (Major Third) and a C (perfect fifth).
