Assessment for learning and development

The purpose of the Initial Assessment is to decide whether the child is a child in need, the nature of any services required, from where and within what times scales, and whether a more detailed core assessment should be carried out. Early Childhood Assessment. Early childhood assessment is a tool used to gather and provide educators, parents, and families with critical information about a child's development and growth.

In Massachusetts, licensed early childhood programs are now required to include a child assessment component in their programs.

An important part of assessment is the observation of a meal in which the child is presented with familiar and unfamiliar food and a variety of different food textures. The assessment of young children (age 0-5) should incorporate a developmental, relational, and biological perspective on the presenting symptoms and include data collected on interview, observation of dyadic or triadic interactions, as well scores on validated screening tools.

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
